## THE WNBA LA CHAPTER: OUR VISION FOR 2008

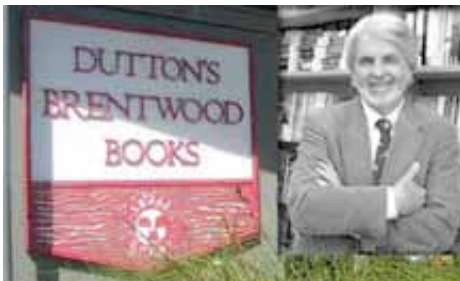
